The First G-I-N Regional Community

Why form a North American Regional Community within G-I-N?

- Tremendous heterogeneity in guideline developers, methods, and quality; limited or absent national standards
- Duplication of effort resulting many differing guidelines on similar topics
- Euro-centered focus of G-I-N with high cost of membership and far away meetings
- Need for collaboration and networking to share best practices
- Concerns over funding and support



Original "About Us" Description 2011

Background of G-I-N North America

The exploratory session for G-I-N North America was held in Chicago at the 7th Annual G-I-N Conference in August 2010. About 100 attendees expressed universal enthusiasm and support for establishing a North American community:

- For about two-thirds of attendees this was their first exposure to G-I-N
- All agreed that establishing a community to discuss challenges faced by North American guideline developers would be of tremendous value
- Many stated that their organizations would be interested in G-I-N membership, especially if an annual satellite meeting were established in North America
- Leadership of the Cochrane Collaboration viewed this as an attractive joint endeavor

Establishing the North American Community

The G-I-N Board agreed in October, 2010 to pilot test regional chapters. A preliminary steering group was formed with North American and G-I-N representatives, resulting in Terms for Reference that led to a more permanent steering committee in April 2011. Interest in G-I-N North America was reaffirmed in May, 2011 when the community was officially launched during an invited presentation at The Institute of Medicine's workshop on implementing standards for trustworthy clinical practice guidelines.




